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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

AP U.S. History is a challenging course that is meant to be the equivalent to a college history course. It is a two semester survey of American history from the age of exploration to the present. Advanced reading and writing skills, along with a willingness to devote considerable time to homework and study are necessary to succeed. While placing emphasis on critical and evaluative thinking skills, essay writing, and interpretation of original documents, we will be working together to prepare each other for the AP Exam offered in May! REQUIRED MATERIALS:

I would recommend that each student have a notebook and a folder specifically for this class. As a substitute, a three-ring binder with loose-leaf paper is acceptable. Get in the habit of printing completed assignments, notes, review material, etc. In addition to these materials, each student is expected to bring their textbook (*American History 15th ed., by Alan Brinkley*) along with a writing utensil to class. Students who consistently forget class materials will see a reflection in their participation grade.

UNITS OF STUDY

We will focus our study on everything from pre-Columbus until present day events. Some topics will require more attention than others. During this time we will master the following historical thinking skills: chronological reasoning, comparison and contextualization, crafting historical arguments from historical evidence, and historical interpretation and synthesis.

GRADING:

Course grades will be based on a weighted grade scale (60% - "Assessment," 40% - "Practice," No Final Exam – 1st Semester). Note that not all homework assignments will fall into the Practice category. Students will be assessed based on their performances on tests, quizzes, homework, projects and other class assignments. Class involvement, attitude, and effort are all class requirements expected on a daily basis.

The grading scale is:

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90% and up....A (excellent)
89-80%......B (above average)
79-70%.......C (average)
69-60%......D (below average)
Below 60%......Failure
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Assignments are due on the due date. Absent work completed in a timely fashion will, of course, be given full credit.

ABSENCE POLICY:

Assignments are due on the due date. Absent work completed in a timely fashion will, of course, be given full credit. Other than that, no late work will be accepted.

EXPECTATIONS AND TIPS FOR SUCCESS:

- The reading load is heavy! You must keep up with the assignments in order to succeed. A calendar that describes deadlines for readings will be given to you at the beginning of each month.
- Students must be responsible for learning material not necessarily discussed in class.
- Because the AP Exam is given in early May, it is imperative to move quickly through the extensive content knowledge that will be necessary for the exam.
- Students must independently take notes on lectures, discussions, and readings.
- It is not unusual for students to feel overwhelmed at first...give yourself time to adjust. As you become accustomed to the course format and readings, things will fall into place.
